AIR POLLUTION: AFRICA'S INVISIBLE, SILENT KILLER

Air pollution remains a major challenge in Africa. About 600,000 deaths every year across the continent are associated with this invisible killer. [...]

Air pollution is caused by harmful particulates and gases [...]. These pollutants cause disease and death to humans, damage to other living organisms such as animals and food crops, and harm our ecosystems. Air pollution is caused by indoor and outdoor activities though the latter, which is largely a result of burning fossil fuels to produce electricity and to power vehicles, is responsible for most of the world's air pollution. Large and small scale industrial activities also cause air pollution by emitting substances into the air [...].

[...] In Africa, the increasing level of urbanization coupled with poor urban planning leads to large numbers of people living in congested

and poorly serviced housing. This serves to exacerbate the problem of pollution.
