The Archangel Metatron

It was in 1665 BC that the greatest of Archangels, Metatron, agreed to assist mankind by coming to Earth as a human being and was born into a fairly well-to-do Jewish family in Thebes, Egypt. As a young boy he came to the attention of the current Pharaoh who was still a relatively young man, and consequently was allowed to go to school in the temple, a privilege not normally open to those of the Jewish faith in Egypt at that time. As you will understand and expect he excelled in all matters of learning and from the time he was twelve years onwards was conferring with the great priests and priestesses of the temples.
